Glossary

Unleavened Bread

Scripture Concentration - Acts 20:7-12

And upon the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them, ready to depart on the morrow; and continued his speech until midnight. And there were many lights in the upper chamber, where they were gathered together. and there sat in a window a certain young man named Eutychus, being fallen into a deep sleep: and as Paul was long preaching, he sunk down with sleep, and fell down from the third loft, and was taken up dead. And Paul went down, and fell on him, and embracing him said, Trouble not yourselves; for his life is in him. When he therefore was come up again, and had broken bread, and eaten, and talked a long while, even till break of day, so he departed. And they brought the young man alive, and were not a little comforted.

Observation

Have you ever fallen asleep in church? Has church ever taken so long that remaining in the spirit seemed impossible? In the case of Eutychus, he not only fell asleep, but while sleep, he fell out of the window, broke his neck and died. This catastrophic even interrupted Paul's preaching. Paul stopped preaching to minister to Eutychus, and bring him back to life. Like Eutychus, today's church has nodded off. All one has to do is to look at the loss of influence and relevancy today's church has on the culture, and it will conclude that the church has fallen asleep. It is bad to know that the church has fallen asleep, but it's worst to know that while asleep, many churches have fallen, and some of the falls have been fatal.

When the death of a church occurs, many begin mourning and planning the funeral, but the call of God is to raise that church back to life. We are not in the business to memorialize, but rather to resurrect.

Drugs have deadened our emotions. Our potential is being murdered by poverty and illiteracy. Our purpose is being assassinated by drugs and underground economies. Our families are dying daily from infidelity, pornography, and cyber-sex affairs. It's resurrection time! It's time to resurrect our communities! It's time to resurrect our family and friends. It's time to wake up the church – to bring it back to life.

Compelling is a word often used to describe one's call to ministry. Scripture Concentration

And finding disciples, we tarried there seven days: who said to Paul through the Spirit, that he should not go up to Jerusalem. And when we had accomplished those days, we departed and went our way; and they all brought us on our way, with wives and children, till we were out of the city: and we kneeled down on the shore, and prayed. And when we had taken our leave one of another, we took ship; and they returned home again. And when we had finished our course from Tyre, we came to Ptolemais, and saluted the brethren, and abode with them one day. And the next day we that were of Paul's company departed, and came unto Caesarea: and we entered into the house of Philip the evangelist, which was one of the seven; and abode with him. And the same man had four daughters, virgins, which did prophesy.

Observation

Tucked away in the book of Acts is a little known and often unread Scripture that speaks of Philip the evangelist and his four daughters who were prophetesses. The poignant point and principle of this Scripture can easily be missed.

Philip was one of the original deacons of the upstart New Testament Church. Philip progressed from a member of the church, to a leader of the church, to a leader of leaders within the church. And while his ministry accomplishments are noteworthy, his greatest accomplishment was the multi-generational influence that motivated his four daughters to follow his leadership footsteps.

In a patriarchal male dominated culture, Philip defied societal norms and developed his daughters to utilize their spiritual gifts and talents to fulfill significant voids and vacuums in ministry. They were not trained to be women prophets, they were trained for ministry, and they just happened to be women. The call of God on believers does not end with accepting Jesus and His teachings. It expands to using our leadership influence to impact multigenerations for the cause of Christ. That doesn't end with us, it must continue to our offsprings and those to whom God has called us to mentor.
