It was the year 1865, two years after the Emancipation Proclamation was signed by President Lincoln. The original pioneers of this great church numbering 318, and having a basement form of worship were amicably granted a letter of separation from their white mother church, Court Street Baptist Church. Following the American Civil War, the Rev. E. G. Coprew became the First pastor of the Zion Baptist Church, and also moderated the Colored Shiloh Baptist Association, at that time, the state's largest and most important black Baptist association. By 1875, the Zion membership was over 1,000 members. If you've never heard the live stories of what this church was like in the early years, sermon clips and recent interviews from former pastors, recollections of the ZBC experience from its own members, a glance of the historical ZBC ministries and the church's impact on the local community, then you don't want to miss this opportunity to obtain your own personal copy of this church's rich history.
